## Letter from the Pastor

Greetings!

The eyes of all look to You, and You give them their food in due season. You open your hand; You satisfy the desire of every living thing. (Psalm 145:15-16)

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, many people think of God as a watchmaker. He created the universe, wound it up, set it into motion, now and again He might check on it. This is the false teaching of Deism. Our Lutheran theology teaches differently: God is sovereign over every aspect of creation. "...*He upholds the universe by the word of his power*." (Hebrews 1:3) This means that God is intimately involved in every aspect of His creation, from the laws of physics, the affairs of the nations, to the fall of a single sparrow. (Mat 10:29) This means He is intimately involved in your life at every moment, whether you are a believer or not.

Lutherans teach that God is the King of two kingdoms: the spiritual kingdom and the earthly kingdom. In both of these, God is active and works through physical means. For example, in the spiritual kingdom God works through the physical means of water, bread and wine and the spoken Word. So the Word and Sacraments of the Church are the means of grace by which God serves you in mercy and forgiveness.

In the earthly kingdom, God works through the means of vocation. So when we pray, *"Give us this day our daily bread,"*(Matthew 6:9-13) God actively meets our needs through our economy, employers and employees, technology, manufacturing, service industries and so on.

This is also true for the family. "God invented families," as Gene Veith Jr put it, "God ordained that new life come into the world—and be cared for and raised into adulthood—through the work of a man and a woman who come together into a family. Husband, wife, father, mother are vocations through which God extends His creation and exercises His love."

What does this mean? God is just as active in His earthly kingdom as He is in His spiritual kingdom. Your vocation is a means of Grace. God is actively at work through you as you perform your daily tasks. Each one of us contributes according to our God given talents, gifts, and opportunities. No matter what our situation in life may be, we all are masks of God. Behind these masks, God is hidden and continually blesses and sustains his creation. This is why I like to remind you that, "*you are blessed to be a blessing!*" (continued on page 2)
