Greetings brothers and sisters in Christ.

Sombrero Beach will be full most weekends until the weather cools again in November. This cycle of winter and summer visitors means the slow summers of years past are not so slow now. It seems that the rush of the world is here to stay in the Keys.

This rush is also evident in the way we consume information, in particular news. The 24-hour news cycle happens in such a way that what is news today is old news 24 to 48 hours later. Things that happened last week seem like ancient history.

What I am describing here is that everything seems to be in motion, and the rate of that motion is increasing. This ever-increasing rate in the movement of people and information through time means things around us change quickly. This rate of change in our lives will increase over time.

Recognizing this rapidity of change can help the Christian discern what it means to be in the world but not of the world. Yes, we are in the chaos but we are not part of it. We don't contribute to it. A couple verses are coming to mind from the letter of James chapter 1:17-18.

"Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change."

The temptation for us is to be drawn away from God by the enticement and deception of rapid change. The temptation is to lose our anchor in Christ and enter into a vortex in which we have no footing as we are pulled into a downward spiral. But Saint James keeps us sober minded. He warns us,

"Blessed is the man who remains steadfast under trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him. Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am being tempted by God," for God cannot be tempted with evil, and he himself tempts no one. But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings for death."

Then say the Lord's Prayer followed by:

Lord God, heavenly Father, bless us and these Your gifts which we receive from your bountiful goodness, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Or

Lord God, heavenly Father, we thank you for Your gifts which we are about to receive from your bountiful goodness, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The important thing to remember is to be thankful, thankful to God our heavenly Father. All good and perfect gifts come from Him alone. Thankfulness keeps us grounded.
